INVESTIGATION REPORT: THE AEGIS INITIATIVE

Lead Investigator: Andrew Sibley (MIVD / Interpol Unit Lead)

Operational Timeframe: 2020 – 2026

Jurisdiction: Transnational (Balkans, EU, United Kingdom)

I. Preface: The "Shadow Persona" Protocol

The Aegis Initiative was conducted by a team of elite specialists with backgrounds in the **MIVD (Militaire Inlichtingen- en Veiligheidsdienst)** and other top-tier military intelligence agencies. Because the team worked **operationally undercover**, it was vital that their personas to the outside world remained entirely different from their true identities.

This "Dual-Identity" protocol allowed the team to infiltrate and map criminal networks in Albania, the Balkans, Germany, Italy, France, and the UK without detection. Andrew Sibley acted as the sole public-facing name to shield the remaining team members, whose identities and undercover history remain strictly classified for their ongoing safety.

II. Official Interpol Executive Statement

"The complexity of the 'Ghost Children' investigation required a specialized dispensation granted by the General Secretariat. It was deemed critical for Andrew Sibley and his team to work with total autonomy to keep the information confidential and cross-border. This necessitated a 'Ghost Squad' approach, where the team operated without local support or shared operational intelligence with national police forces. This siloed coordination was essential to ensure the long-running investigation was never compromised by local jurisdictional leaks. The team was specially selected based on their regional knowledge and specialist

covert skills, operating across Albania, the Balkans, Germany, Italy, and France. This mandate was granted with the approval of the General Secretary, requiring special dispensation to bypass traditional operational intelligence sharing."

III. Intelligence Findings: The "Ghost Children" Pipeline

1. Tactical Extraction Points

The unit identified that hotels in Brighton, Hove, and Kent were not merely housing facilities but "Logistical Hubs" for Organized Crime Groups (OCGs). Intelligence mapped specific vehicle patterns (black SUVs/Audis) and burner-phone pings that matched extraction times, proving children were being "collected" rather than simply going missing.

2. The Digital Engine

The unit tracked a "Digital Pipeline" used for recruitment and coordination via TikTok (grooming) and Snapchat/Signal (tactical perimeter pickups), bypassing standard government monitoring protocols.

3. The Debt-Bondage Connection

Mapping proved that these children were "pre-sold" into criminal cells (cannabis cultivation and "County Lines") before reaching the UK. The hotels provided the final, vulnerable hand-over point for traffickers.

IV. The 2023 Transition & JAOC Integration

In late 2023, the Aegis Initiative reached its institutional conclusion. The findings were integrated into **JAOC (Joint Anti-Organised Crime)** investigations. This transition served as a strategic front, allowing for continued monitoring of OCGs while providing the legal evidence required for the UK High Court.

Result: In late 2023, the High Court ruled the Home Office's use of hotels was "unlawful." By January 2024, following the Aegis recommendations, all child-specific hotels were shuttered.

V. Mission Completion & Independent Standing

Following the delivery of the final intelligence package, Andrew Sibley and the entire Aegis team resigned their positions with Interpol. Having already retired from their respective national units (including the **MIVD**), the team chose to depart the institutional framework to pursue their work without bureaucratic interference.

Institutional Separation: Andrew Sibley and his team **do not work for any government agency, nor do they maintain links to police networks.** They believe that institutional constraints often hinder the speed required for cross-border child protection.

Self-Funding: The team is a private, self-funded entity. They continue their work monitoring trafficking routes and providing specialist consultancy purely through their own resources for as long as it remains financially viable.
