December 2025 in Context

- **4 Dec:** Bashir arrested at Manchester Airport, charged with preparing acts of terrorism and disseminating extremist publications.
- **23 Dec:** Saadaoui and Hussein convicted of plotting an Islamic State-inspired gun attack against Manchester’s Jewish community, potentially Britain’s deadliest terror attack.

These two incidents mark **December as one of the most significant months for UK counter-terrorism in 2025**, with both prevention and prosecution outcomes.
